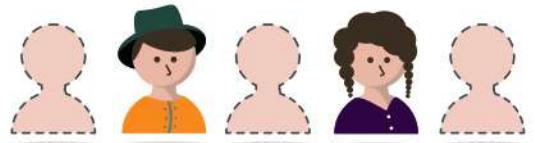

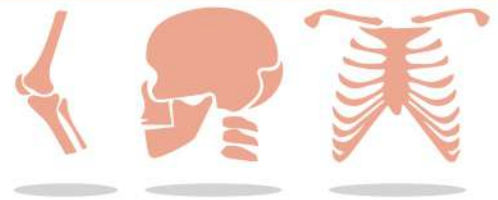

THE WORK FOCUSES ON

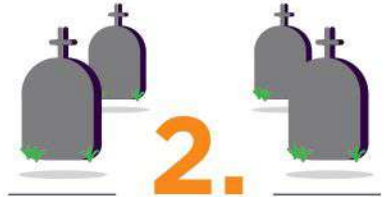
identifying and determining the cause of death of various human remains that may be related to 3 massacres of migrants:

THE FORENSIC COMMISSION WILL ALLOW:

1.

Cross-checking information collected by the organizations, information collected in the Forensic Banks of Central America and México, with the information contained in PGR files on the 3 massacres indicated above.



2.

It will allow the identification of remains pending identification of the 3 cases.



4.

Establish good practices for the identification of persons and the treatment of victims' relatives.



3.

Establish forensic information cross-checking mechanisms between Mexico and Central America.
